GUDI PADWA



Gudi Padwa is celebrated to mark the beginning of the year as per the Hindu calendar. We Celebrated Gudipadwa on 16th April 2021. According to the Hindu calendar, this festival falls in the Shukla Paksha (brighter half) of the Chaitra month.

MAHAVIR JAYANTI



Mahavir Jayanti is one of the most important religious festivals in Jainism. It celebrates the birth of Lord Mahavira, the twenty-fourth and last Tirthankara of present Avasarpiṇī. On 26th April 2021, the school celebrated the day with great fervour. Students watched short movies and videos on the life and teachings of lord Mahavira.

According to Mahavira, to live a righteous life one should follow the following principles:

- Nonviolence (Ahimsa) causing no harm to the living beings
- Truthfulness (Satya) to speak the truth
- Non-stealing (Asteya) not to possess things that do not belong to you
- Chastity (Bramacharya) not to indulge in sensual pleasures
- Non-attachment (Aparigraha) not to get attached to material things.

His teachings are the main pillars of Jainism, also known as 'Jain Agamas'





Maharashtra Day is celebrated to commemorate the formation of the state of Maharashtra after its division from Bombay State on May 1, 1960. 1st of May is also celebrated as international Labour Day or workers day.

Maharashtra Day was celebrated on the virtual platform this year. The students of Grades V to VIII participated enthusiastically in the activities planned for Maharashtra


Students made best use of technology for their presentations. The Students of Grade VIII recorded their songs and dances for Maharashtra Day Celebration.






