

## RUBIK'S CUBE ART

The majority of Rubik's Cube art consists of arranging many cubes in a 2D arrangement to produce portraits and landscapes. Each individual cube must be placed so that the specific coloured squares are aligned before hundreds of cubes are assembled to create the artwork. You have to arrange each individual cube to align the particular coloured squares so hundreds of cubes come together to form the artwork.

If someone draws a portrait, it might look better and be more accurate than a Rubik's Cube mosaic, but because it's hard to solve even a single cube, let alone hundreds to make an artwork, it stands out and looks cooler.
